CALIFORNIA ELECTIONS DATA ARCHIVE

INTRODUCTION

The California Elections Data Archive (CEDA) is a joint project of the Center for California Studies and the Institute for Social Research, both of California State University, Sacramento and the office of the California Secretary of State. The purpose of CEDA is to provide researchers, citizens, public agencies and other interested parties with a single repository of local election data. With over 6,000 local jurisdictions in California, the task of monitoring local elections is nearly impossible for individuals. CEDA addresses this problem through the creation of a single, cost-effective and easily accessible source of local election data. CEDA includes both candidate and ballot measure results for county, city, community college, and school district elections throughout the State. CEDA thus represents the only comprehensive repository of local election results in California.

Election data are collected periodically throughout the year. This enables CEDA to incorporate results from special elections as well as all regularly scheduled elections. Election results from counties, cities, and community college and school districts are entered in the CEDA database from which three standard CEDA reports are generated. These reports include:

- County Elections: Candidates, ballot designations, and vote totals for all elected county offices; vote totals and text for county ballot measures.
- City Elections: Candidates, ballot designations, and vote totals for all elected city offices; vote totals and text for all city ballot measures.
- Community College and School District Elections: Candidates, ballot designations, and vote totals for all elective community college and school district offices; vote totals and text for all district ballot measures.

Ballot measures for all jurisdictions are coded according to type (e.g., charter amendment, bond measure, initiative, etc.) and to subject (e.g., taxes, education, public safety, governance, etc.).

THE CENTER FOR CALIFORNIA STUDIES

Located at California State University, Sacramento, the Center for California Studies is a public policy, public service and curricular support unit of the California State University. The Center's location in the state Capital and its ability to draw upon the resources of the entire State University system give it a unique capacity for making contributions to public policy development and the public life of California. Center programs cover four broad areas: administration of the nationally known Assembly, Senate, Executive, and Judicial Administration Fellowship Programs; university-state government liaison and applied policy research; civic education and community service through forums, conferences and issue dialogues; and curricular support activity in the interdisciplinary field of California Studies.

INSTITUTE FOR SOCIAL RESEARCH

Established in 1989, the Institute for Social Research (ISR) is an interdisciplinary center serving the research needs of federal, state and local government agencies, non-profit organizations and university administration, faculty and students. These services include research and sampling design, measurement, coding and data entry, computer assisted telephone and field interviewing, mailed surveys, focus groups, data base management, statistical analysis and report production. ISR has completed numerous contracts with over 40 state and community agencies, several private firms and many administrative units of the university. Faculty affiliates of the Institute offer expertise in a wide variety of disciplines, including the social sciences, health and human services, engineering and education.

CALIFORNIA SECRETARY OF STATE

The Secretary of State is, among other duties, California's chief elections officer with the responsibility of administering the provisions of the Elections Code. The Secretary must compile state election returns and issue certificates of election to winning candidates; compile the returns and certify the results of initiative and referendum elections; certify acts delayed by referendum and prepare and file a statement of vote. Recent legislation permits but does not mandate that the Secretary of State compile local election results.

HISTORICAL PATTERNS AND TRENDS

CEDA now encompasses eight full years of election data, including two gubernatorial years (1998 and 2002), two statewide elections (1996 and 2000) and four odd-numbered years devoted to local races. Given this amount of information, it is appropriate to begin with some reflection on multi-year trends before moving to a more specific focus on 2002 contests.

BALLOT MEASURES

With respect to ballot measures, there are both consistent features across elections and what appear to be emerging trends. Among the consistent features are the following:

- Taxes, ordinances and charter amendments have been concentrated in the even-numbered years when statewide and gubernatorial elections are held. Bond measures have also been more numerous in those years but occur in significant numbers in the odd-year elections as well.
- Pass rates for tax measures, however, are consistently higher in odd-numbered years (an average of 55% for 1995, 1997, 1999 and 2001) compared with 45% for the four even-numbered years between 1996 and 2002. (Trend Table A)
- Local ballot measures most commonly address education, with the number of such propositions exceeding the number of measures dealing with other specific topics in all except a single year; in 1996 there were more governance than education measures. (See Trend Table B)

- Bonds and tax measures make up a majority (52%) of all ballot measures over the eight years of election results tracked by CEDA. Ordinances and Charter Amendments, effecting policy shifts in local government, constitute another 36%. (Trend Table A)
- A major change in county governance occurred around the turn of the 21st century. Community Service Districts (CSDs) were introduced as an accommodation to the restrictions posed by Proposition 13. Portions of a county could form a special district and agree to tax themselves to provide services that the population as a whole might not support. CEDA began tracking community service district ballot measures in 1998. Speculation that the number of such measures might increase over time is not supported by the data: the number of such measures in 2002 was lower than the average for the four prior years (18 vs. 28). Since 1998, 119 ballot measures dealt with Community Service Districts in 25 different counties. Five counties, however, accounted for over half of CSD-related measures -- Contra Costa (8), El Dorado (10), Kern (12), Marin (22), and San Diego (16). (Trend Table G)
- With few exceptions, the measures dealt with taxes (83) and Gann Limit issues (16) and provided services to those willing and able to pay for them that may no longer be provided to the county at large as a result of the tax limits introduced by Proposition 13. All of the Gann Limit measures passed. Like other tax measures, CSD-related tax measures were more apt to pass in the odd-year elections (64% in 1999 and 82% in 2001) and more apt to fail in 2000 and 2002 (with pass rates of 29% and 36% respectively). (Trend Table D) Public safety is the most common focus of CSD measures (41 of the 119 or 34%), followed by general services (16), transportation (14) and public facilities (12). (Trend Table E)

Emerging trends include the following:

- Within the history of CEDA (1994 to present), California voters faced a record number of 657 ballot measures (16% more than the average of the past three even numbered years). Most of the increase in ballot measures occurred within school districts (up 89% over the previous even numbered years). This increase in school district ballot measures appears to be due to the growth in the number of bonds following passage of Proposition 39, which permitted a lowering of the threshold for passage from 67% to 55%.
- The passage rate for all measures has increased over the past two years. From 1995 through 2000 the pass rate ranged from a 57% to 61%-- a strikingly consistent pattern. In 2001 and 2002 the pass rate jumped to 70% and 65% respectively. The increase is due to an unusually large number of school bonds (more than doubling the average for the previous six years) that passed in record numbers (76% in each year compared with an average pass rate of 56% for the previous six). The higher pass rate appears to have been the result of a conscious choice made by voters. In 2000 the California electorate approved Proposition 39, lowering the minimum threshold for passing school bonds from 67% to 55%, if the bond proposal meets the requirements set forth in the proposition. School districts are still permitted to issue bonds requiring a pass rate of 67%. However, only 10% of school bonds required the higher threshold for passage in 2002. The 228 school bond measures in 2002 may be a sign of greater willingness to push forward such measures in light of the lower limits set by Proposition 39.

CANDIDATES

With respect to candidate races, continuity dominates. Among the consistent features of local candidate races are the following:

- The total number of candidates for local offices (county boards of supervisors, other county offices, city councils, and local school boards) is consistently over twice as high in even-numbered than in odd-numbered years.
- Off-year elections are dominated by school district candidates. In those years, they make up between 62% and 69% of all candidates on the ballot. Although there are many more school board races in even-numbered years, these candidates make up less than half of all candidates (40% to 46%) when most county and city races are decided.
- About one in four to one in three candidates for all types of offices are incumbents.

Emerging trends in candidate elections include the following:

- There are two potentially interesting changes in candidate elections that may be in the works. The first pertains to the *number of total candidates*. California voters faced a record number of 6072 candidates in 2002 (up 13% over the average for the past three even-numbered years). The increase in candidates occurred primarily at the county level where the number increased by almost 50% over the average of the preceding three even-numbered years. (Trend Table C) The large increase in county candidates is due to two factors: the coincidence of a gubernatorial election year and an unusual number of Community Service District and County Service Area candidates. When CSD and CSA candidates (266) are removed, the number of candidates in 2002 is very close to the number in 1998. This "unusual number" of CSD/CSA candidates is the culmination of a steady and dramatic increase in CSD/CSA candidates over the past five years, beginning with 22 in 1998 and almost doubling between 1999 and 2001 (from 109 to 186 candidates). Indeed, in these two, odd-numbered years, CSD/CSA candidates constituted most of the county candidates on the ballot (79% and 98% respectively), since other county offices are typically filled in the even-numbered years. (Trend Table F)
- The second trend that may be evident is an increase in the *proportion* of candidates who are incumbents. Incumbency has been incrementally but steadily increasing over CEDA's eight-year history. It is not clear why this is occurring.

2002 ELECTION DATA

BALLOT MEASURES

Bonds, tax measures and ordinances predominated in 2002 (245,155 and 136 respectively), accounting for 89% of all measures. City ballot measures continued to outnumber those for the county and school districts (309 compared with 98 county and 250 school district measures). The number of school district bonds more than doubled the average for the preceding five years (228 vs. 104 per year).

The overall passage rate for ballot measures in 2002 was 65%. Fewer county and city measures passed (56% and 60% respectively), while again school district measures were unusually successful (76%, capping a dramatic increase from 1995 to the present). (Trend Table A) The differing pass rates are a function of the types of measures associated with these jurisdictions. Most bonds are proposed by school districts. Tax measures and ordinances are largely city affairs, passing with equal frequency (54% of each passed). (Table A)

Education measures (largely school district bonds) accounted for over a third of all ballot measures (38%). Governance issues and revenue measures were the second and third most frequent topics, making up 22% and 13% of all measures. Almost two-thirds passed (66% of governance measures and 62% of revenue measures). Land use and public safety were the only significant topic categories. Land use measures generally failed (57%) while public safety measures passed by the same margin (57%). (Table B)

County Measures. Voters in the 58 counties approved a clear majority of the 98 ballot measures (56%). Ordinances (39) and taxes (38) predominated -- a not untypical pattern for even-numbered year elections. (Table 1.3) Somewhat atypically, more of the tax measures passed (45%) than usual for an even numbered year (between 29% and 38% from 1996 through 2000). Tax measures have been more successful, though less numerous, in odd-year elections (with 50% to 77% passing in 1997, 1999, and 2001). (Trend Table A)

County governance issues accounted for a third of all ballot measures in 2002 (35%). There were more on the ballot in 2002 than there had been since 1996 (34 compared with 45 in the earlier year). Pass rates for these measures remain high, varying between 64% and 75% in the even-numbered years when they are more likely to appear on the ballot. A dozen revenue measures appeared on county ballots in 2002, two-thirds of which passed. In contrast, 15 public safety measures and 11 public facilities measures were more likely to fail (two-thirds and 64% respectively). With the exception of 1997 when two measures were floated and failed, this was the lowest pass rate for public safety measures since CEDA began in 1995. Similarly, public facilities measures experienced the second lowest pass rate in CEDA's eight years. (Table 1.4 and Trend Table B)

City Measures. Voters in municipal elections faced a total of 309 ballot measures, a fairly typical number for even-numbered year elections. Pass rates for the city measures were only marginally higher than those for the county measures (60% vs. 56%). Taxes and ordinances accounted for almost two-thirds of all city ballot measures (63%) with charter amendments making up another fourth (23%). Four counties (Alameda, Los Angeles, Orange and San Diego) accounted for 40% of all city ballot measures. (Table 1.3)

With the exception of 2001, city tax measures were more successful in 2002 than in any other year tracked by CEDA (1995 forward); 72% of tax measures passed in 2001 and 58% in 2002, compared with 29% to 52% in earlier years. (Trend Table A) The most common mechanism for taxation was a transient occupancy tax, with 68% of the 37 measures passing. There were 28 utility tax measures on the ballot, with 50% passing, and 21 property tax measures, of which 57% passed. These three types of taxes accounted for 84% of the city tax measures. The goal of roughly half (53 of 102) of the tax measures was to create, increase or continue a tax, while only 15% had repealing, reducing or limiting a tax as the goal. Taxation to support safety-related services (fire, emergency medical services) was the only other goal of a significant number of tax measures (15); two-thirds of those passed. Most (83%) of the city bond

measures passed as well. These generally covered fire and emergency services and facilities such as museums and libraries.

Charter amendments were successful as always, with 77% passing, while ordinances were less successful than usual -- only 48% passed compared with pass rates of 53% to 61% in all but one of the CEDA years containing this type of measure. Ordinances typically dealt with land use and zoning issues. (Trend Table A)

Governance issues dominated city ballots as they did those in the county, accounting for a third (36%) of all measures in both the city and county and passing in similar proportions (65% in the city, 71% in the county). Revenue measures, making up almost a fourth (22 or 23%) of city ballot measures, met with some success (63% passed) although pass rates were higher for revenue measures in 2001 (89% of the 27 measures passed). Public safety issues were twice as successful on city than county ballots (70% vs. 33%) while the reverse was true for land use measures (71% of seven land use measures passed in the county, while only 38% of 37 measures passed in the city). Transportation measures were more apt to fail on both city and county ballots (only 40% passed in each jurisdiction) while general services measures tended to pass (57% and 62% in the county and city respectively). (Table 1.4)

School Measures. Voters in community college and school districts passed judgment on a record number of ballot measures (250 in 2002 compared with an annual average of 132 between 1995 and 2001). Most of these were bond measures (91%), three-fourths of which passed. (Table 1.3) The bond pass rates of the last two years (76% in 2001 and 77% in 2002) are the highest for school bonds in the 8-year history of CEDA; pass rates in the six earlier years averaged 56%. (Trend Table A)

Bonds were much more likely to pass than fail in most counties. Only in some of the smaller counties (Kings, Lassen, Madera, Mendocino, Modoc, Mono, Placer, San Luis Obispo and Siskiyou) were bonds more apt to fail. (Table 1.3) Los Angeles and a group of moderate sized counties placed a disproportionate number of education measures (mostly bonds) on the ballot.

Contra Costa, Monterey, Orange, Sacramento, Santa Clara, Sonoma, and Tulare, along with Los Angeles, accounted for 41% of all education measures. (Table 1.4)

CANDIDATE ELECTIONS

The record number of candidates for county, city and school district offices contained a record number of incumbents. The proportion of incumbents in each jurisdiction and among all candidates was higher in 2002 than in any of the previous seven years: 32% of those running for the County Board of Supervisors, 27% of those running for city council and 36% of those running for the school board were incumbents -- or 34% of all candidates. (Trend Table C)

As in the past, incumbents tended to prevail (82% overall), particularly in the lesser-known county and city offices (90% of incumbents in each jurisdiction won). This is consistent with national figures on city council races where, a recent study indicated, the average reelection rate was about 84%.¹ Since only a portion of incumbents are up for re-election in any given year and some choose not to run, the proportion of winning candidates who are incumbents is much lower than the re-election rate. Incumbents were the winning candidates in a majority of

the races for county supervisor (55.6%) and school board member (56.4%) and in almost two-thirds of those for other county and city offices (63.9% and 63.4% respectively). Only in City Council races did a majority of non-incumbents win (51.2%). (Table C)

County races. County-wide, almost 40% of the candidates running were incumbents, with incumbents prevailing in 62% of the races. Incumbents were heavy favorites. Over 93% of incumbents for the less visible county offices won (Sheriff/Coroner/Marshal, Treasurer/Tax Collector, Assessor/Auditor/Clerk/Recorder, Superintendent of Schools and Superior Court Judge), while 78% to 79% of county supervisors, CSD directors and district attorneys prevailed. The number of candidates running for CSD directorships outnumber all but the field of county supervisor candidates (266 vs. 362). (Table 2.2)

City races. There are fewer incumbents in the more contested city races: city council (26.5%) and Mayor (29.1%) compared with 40% to 59% for the lower profile positions (City Treasurer, Clerk, Attorney, Auditor, etc.). Incumbents won more often in all but the city council races where a majority (51%) of the winning candidates were challengers. When they run, however, incumbents are heavily favored to win in city as well as county elections; at least 79% of incumbents who chose to run, win. (Table 2.2)

School Board races. There are more incumbents in school board elections than in city or county races, but they win in similar numbers (79% of incumbents prevail). A solid majority of winning candidates are incumbents (56%). (Table 2.2)
