INTRODUCTION

The California Elections Data Archive (CEDA) is a joint project of the Center for California Studies and the Institute for Social Research, both of California State University, Sacramento and the office of the California Secretary of State. The purpose of CEDA is to provide researchers, citizens, public agencies and other interested parties with a single repository of local election data. With over 6,000 local jurisdictions in California, the task of monitoring local elections is nearly impossible for individuals. CEDA addresses this problem through the creation of a single, cost-effective and easily accessible source of local election data. CEDA includes both candidate and ballot measure results for county, city, community college, and school district elections throughout the State. CEDA thus represents the only comprehensive repository of local election results in California.

Election data are collected periodically throughout the year. This enables CEDA to incorporate results from special elections as well as all regularly scheduled elections. Election results from counties, cities, and community college and school districts are entered in the CEDA database from which three standard CEDA reports are generated. These reports include:

- County Elections: Candidates, ballot designations, and vote totals for all elected county offices; vote totals and text for county ballot measures.
- City Elections: Candidates, ballot designations, and vote totals for all elected city offices; vote totals and text for all city ballot measures.
- Community College and School District Elections: Candidates, ballot designations, and vote totals for all elective community college and school district offices; vote totals and text for all district ballot measures.

Ballot measures for all jurisdictions are coded according to type (e.g., charter amendment, bond measure, initiative, etc.) and to subject (e.g., taxes, education, public safety, governance, etc.).

THE CENTER FOR CALIFORNIA STUDIES

Located at California State University, Sacramento, the Center for California Studies is a public policy, public service and curricular support unit of the California State University. The Center's location in the state Capital and its ability to draw upon the resources of the entire State University system give it a unique capacity for making contributions to public policy development and the public life of California. Center programs cover four broad areas: administration of the nationally known Assembly, Senate, Executive, and Judicial Administration Fellowship Programs; university-state government liaison and applied policy research; civic education and community service through forums, conferences and issue dialogues; and curricular support activity in the interdisciplinary field of California Studies.

INSTITUTE FOR SOCIAL RESEARCH

Established in 1989, the Institute for Social Research (ISR) is an interdisciplinary center serving the research needs of federal, state and local government agencies, non-profit organizations and university administration, faculty and students. These services include research and sampling design, measurement, coding and data entry, computer assisted telephone and field interviewing, mailed surveys, focus groups, data base management, statistical analysis and report production. ISR has completed numerous contracts with over 40 state and community agencies, several private firms and many administrative units of the university. Faculty affiliates of the Institute offer expertise in a wide variety of disciplines, including the social sciences, health and human services, engineering and education.

CALIFORNIA SECRETARY OF STATE

The Secretary of State is, among other duties, California's chief elections officer with the responsibility of administering the provisions of the Elections Code. The Secretary must compile state election returns and issue certificates of election to winning candidates; compile the returns and certify the results of initiative and referendum elections; certify acts delayed by referendum and prepare and file a statement of vote. Recent legislation permits but does not mandate that the Secretary of State compile local election results.

HISTORICAL PATTERNS AND TRENDS

CEDA now encompasses ten full years of election data, including two gubernatorial years (1998 and 2002), three statewide elections (1996, 2000 and 2004) and five odd-numbered years devoted to local races. Given this amount of information, it is appropriate to begin with some reflection on multi-year trends before moving to a more specific focus on 2004 contests.

BALLOT MEASURES

With respect to ballot measures, there are both consistent features across elections and what appear to be emerging trends. Among the consistent features are the following:

- Taxes, ordinances and charter amendments have been concentrated in the even-numbered years when statewide and gubernatorial elections are held. Bond measures have also been more numerous in those years but occur in significant numbers in the odd-year elections as well. (Trend Table A)
- Bonds and tax measures make up a majority (54%) of all ballot measures over the ten years of election results tracked by CEDA. Ordinances and Charter Amendments, effecting policy shifts in local government, constitute another 35%. (Trend Table A)
- School districts are responsible for most of the bonds placed before voters (90% over 10 years). Tax measures are more dispersed, with a strong majority sponsored by cities (58%) and another 23% by counties. (Trend Table A)

- Pass rates for tax measures are consistently higher in odd-numbered years (an average of 56.3% for 1995, 1997, 1999, 2001 and 2003) compared with 46.1% for the five even-numbered years between 1996 and 2004. Conversely, pass rates for bond measures are higher in even-numbered years (68.2% vs. 59.1%). Over the ten year period, bonds were much more likely to pass than tax measures (65% vs. 48.9%). (Trend Table A)
- Local ballot measures most commonly address education, with the number of such propositions exceeding the number of measures dealing with other specific topics in all but one year; in 1996 there were more governance than education measures. (Trend Table B)
- A major change in county governance occurred around the turn of the 21st century. Community Service Districts (CSDs) were introduced as an accommodation to the restrictions posed by Proposition 13. Portions of a county could form a special district and agree to tax themselves to provide services that the population as a whole might not support. CEDA began tracking community service district ballot measures in 1998. Speculation that the number of such measures might increase over time is not supported by the data: the number of such measures in 2004, although higher than the average for the seven preceding years, was right at the average for the three even-numbered years (29 vs. 28). Since 1998, 161 ballot measures dealt with Community Service Districts in 29 different counties. Five counties, however, accounted for over half of CSD-related measures -- Contra Costa (11), El Dorado (18), Kern (15), Marin (23), and San Diego (19). (Trend Table C)
- With few exceptions, CSD measures dealt with taxes (117), Gann Limit issues (18) and ordinances (16), and provided services to those willing and able to pay for them that may no longer be provided to the county at large as a result of the tax limits introduced by Proposition 13. All but one of the Gann Limit measures passed. (Trend Table D)
- Like other tax measures, CSD-related tax measures were more apt to pass in the odd-year elections (57.6%) and more apt to fail in even years (39.3%). However, contrary to the hopes of those establishing CSDs, these tax measures are less apt to pass than tax measures proposed by other governmental units (44% vs. 51% for cities, counties and school districts). (Trend Table D) Indeed, CSD measures as a whole have lower pass rates than those sponsored by other governmental units in the same years (54% vs. 58%). Only county-sponsored tax measures have lower pass rates than CSD tax measures (37% vs. 44%). (Trend Table F)
- Public safety is the most common focus of CSD measures (63 of the 161 or 39%), followed by general services and transportation (17 each) and public facilities (16). (Trend Table E)

Emerging trends include the following:

- Within the history of CEDA (1994 to present), California voters faced a record number of 712 ballot measures in 2004 (21% more than the average of the past four even numbered years). Most of the increase in ballot measures occurred within school districts (up 45% over the average of the previous even numbered years). This increase in school district ballot measures appears to be due to the growth in the number of bonds following passage of Proposition 39 in 2000, which lowered the

threshold for passage from 67% to 55%. Ten-year highs in the number of city and county tax measures and county ordinances also contributed to the large number of ballot measures. (Trend Table A)

- In 2003 and 2004, there was some retreat from the unusually high pass rates for all measures that occurred in 2001 and 2002. From 1995 through 2000 the pass rate had ranged from 57% to 61%-- a strikingly consistent pattern. In 2001 and 2002 the pass rate jumped to 70% and 65% respectively, following voter approval of Proposition 39. In 2003 and 2004, overall pass rates declined to 63% and 62%. The retreat, however, occurred in the passage of tax measures and not in school bonds. Concerned by 9/11, the electorate approved an unusual percentage of all tax measures (72%) in 2001. By 2003 and 2004, pass rates on tax measures were under 50% (48% and 47% respectively). In contrast, 2004 pass rates for bonds remained at the same level as 2002 (75% and 76% respectively).
- The number of ballot measures dealing with public safety increased 62% in the three years following 9/11 compared with the preceding seven years. (Trend Table B)
- The number of revenue measures increased six-fold since 2000 (from 15 to 110 in 2004), when CEDA began separately tracking such measures. (Trend Table B)

CANDIDATES

With respect to candidate races, continuity dominates. Among the consistent features of local candidate races are the following:

- The total number of candidates for local offices (county boards of supervisors, other county offices, city councils, and local school boards) is consistently over twice as high in even-numbered than in odd-numbered years. (Trend Table G)
- Off-year elections are dominated by school district candidates. In those years, they make up between 62% and 69% of all candidates on the ballot. Although there are many more school board races in even-numbered years, these candidates make up less than half of all candidates (40% to 46%) when most county and city races are decided. (Trend Table G)
- About one in four to one in three candidates for all types of offices are incumbents. (Trend Table I)
- Roughly three-fourths of incumbents, irrespective of office, prevail. (Trend Table I)

Emerging trends in candidate elections include the following:

- There are two potentially interesting patterns in candidate elections that are emerging from the multi-year analysis. The first pertains to the *number of total candidates*. All even-numbered years attract a significant number of candidates for county, city and school district offices. However, beginning in 1998, the number of total candidates appears to peak in gubernatorial years (1998 and 2002) due to the further concentration of school district and county candidates in those years. In 2002, California voters faced a record number of 6072 candidates. The increase in candidates occurred primarily at

the county level where the number increased by almost 50% over the average of the preceding three even-numbered years. (Trend Table G) In addition to the greater number of school district and county candidates, an unusual number of Community Service District and County Service Area candidates accounts for the record-setting number of candidates. When CSD and CSA candidates (266) are removed, the number of candidates in 2002 is very close to the number in 1998. This "unusual number" of CSD/CSA candidates is the culmination of a steady and dramatic increase in CSD/CSA candidates over the preceding five years, beginning with 22 in 1998 and almost doubling between 1999 and 2001 (from 109 to 186 candidates). Since 2002, the number of CSD/CSA candidates has leveled off. (Trend Table H)

- The second trend is an increase in the *proportion* of candidates who are incumbents. Incumbency has been incrementally but steadily increasing over CEDA's ten-year history, particularly among city council and school district candidates. It is not clear why this is occurring. (Trend Table I)

2004 ELECTION DATA

BALLOT MEASURES

California's love affair with ballot measures rebounded dramatically in 2004. Last year, 2003, local voters faced only 178 ballot measures, the fewest since 1995. In 2004, the total increased four-fold to 712. The greater number of elections held in even-numbered years guaranteed an increase in the number of ballot measures, but the 2004 total of 712 is significantly more than the 2002 total of 657. Indeed, Californians voted on more local ballot measures than anytime since CEDA records started in 1995.

The 2004 increase in local ballot measure activity over both 2003 and 2002 can be traced to increases in county ballot measures, city ballot measures and measures dealing with bonds, taxes and land use. In 2004, there were 139 county ballot measures or 14.9 percent more than the previous high of 121 measures in 1998. In the five even-numbered elections since 1995, counties have averaged 118 ballot measures. The 338 city ballot measures in 2004 is the second highest total since 1995 and an 9.3 percent increase over the 309 such measures in 2002. The number of school measures also increased over 2003 but the 235 in 2004 was less than the 250 in 2002.

In terms of all local ballot measures, there were notable increases in the number of taxes measures: 258 in 2004 or 36 percent of all measures versus 62 or 35 percent in 2003 and 155 or 24 percent of all measures in 2002. Of the 2004 county measures, 59 were tax measures as compared to 38 in 2002 and the five even-numbered election averages of 43. City ballot measures also saw an increase in tax measures with 148 such measures in 2004 compared to 14 in 2003 and 102 in 2002. Indeed, 50 of the state's 58 counties had some form of local ballot tax measure. The increase in the number of tax measures did not, however, translate into success for measure proponents. Overall, 47 percent of all local tax measures passed with the pass rate for county tax measures being 44 percent and 46 percent for city measures. A majority of tax measures passed in 18 counties, including Contra Costa, San Bernardino, Marin and Tulare Counties. In seven counties voters approved and rejected the same number of tax measures (e.g., in Solano County, voters in the City of Benicia approved a business tax while voters in the Benicia Unified School District rejected a property tax increase). Voters in 25

counties rejected all or a majority of tax measures before them.

The number of bond measures increased over 2003 (179 in 2004 and 22 in 2003) but totaled less than the ten year highs of 245 in 2002 and 135 in 2000. Similarly, the number of ballot measures dealing with land use issues increased in 2004 to 58 as compared to 15 in 2003 and 44 in 2002 but was still less than the ten year average of 36.

The overall pass rate for all local ballot measures in 2004 was 62 percent, which is comparable to recent years (e.g., 62 per cent in 2003, 65 percent in 2002 and a ten year average of 61 percent). Pass rates for county and city measures dropped but the pass rate for school district measures increased. In 2004, 53 percent of county measures were adopted by voters as compared to 64 percent in 2003 and 56 percent in 2002. For city measures, 59 percent passed in 2004 versus 67 percent in 2003 and 60 percent in 2002. School measures had a pass rate of 73 percent in 2004 as compared to 52 percent in 2003 and 75 percent in 2002.

The historic gubernatorial recall election of 2003 did not inspire a similar historic wave of local recall fever in 2004. A total of 11 recall elections were held in 2004 which was more than in 2003 or 2002 (9 and 8 recalls respectively) but less than the ten year average of 18 recalls and far below the record high of 45 recalls in 1997. Humboldt County District Attorney Paul Gallegos survived a recall election as did two members of the Rohnert Park City Council. On the other hand, three in the City of Highland and one in the City of Isleton were recalled. The most dramatic recall occurred in Tulare County where four of five members of the Farmersville Unified School District were recalled.

County Measures. Voters faced a total of 139 county ballot measures of which 74, or 53.2 percent, were approved. By far the most common type of county measure were tax issues: 59 different tax measures, or 41.5 percent of all county ballot measures, dealt with taxes. These measures were generally unsuccessful with only 26 or 44 percent passing. The most common topics were governance (32 or 23 percent of all county measures), public safety (22 or 15.4 percent) and transportation (20 or 14 percent). Transportation and governance issues were generally successful with pass rates of 75 and 66 percent, respectively. Only half of the public safety measures were enacted. Land use issues represented 9.8 percent of county measures but only two of the 14 measures passed. Voters in San Diego County rejected a land-fill proposal while Sutter County voters approved an industrial park. An anti-big box store measure was rejected in Contra Costa County as was a growth cap measure in San Benito County.

City Measures. There were 338 municipal ballot measures in 2004 of which 199 passed for a success rate of 58.8 percent, rather less than the 2003 pass rate of 71 percent but comparable to the 60 percent pass rate in 2002. A plurality were tax measures with 148 or 43.7 percent of all city measures dealing with taxes. The greater number of tax measures in 2004 did not translate into success as only 68 were enacted for a pass rate of 45.9 percent. Ordinances accounted for 27.2 percent of the total while bond measures matched the ten year average of seven. Bonds were, however, less popular than in previous years with only three of the seven 2004 measures passing, the lowest pass rate since 1996. Topics of city measures included governance issues (107 or 31.6 percent of the total), revenue (91 or 26.9 percent), land use (44 or 13 percent) and public safety (33 or 9.7 percent). The majority of governance and land use measures passed (74.7 percent and 63.6 percent, respectively) but only 47.2 percent of revenue measures and 45.4 percent of public safety measures gained voter approval.

An interesting development was the passage of measures creating independently elected mayors in five small cities (Adelanto, Coachella, Grand Terrace, Gustine, and Pismo Beach)

and measures strengthening mayors in Rio Vista, San Diego and West Sacramento. On the other hand, term limits reappeared and were approved in Fountain Valley and National City. The City of Berkeley adopted instant runoff voting for its municipal elections. As noted above, six city council members in three different cities were subject to recall elections with four of the six being recalled.

School District Measures. Voters in community college and school districts faced a total of 235 ballot measures, passing 171 (72.7 percent) and rejecting 64 (27.3 percent). As in past years, bond measures predominated in 2004. Voters faced 172 bond measures and approved 132 (76.7 percent pass rate) thus encumbering themselves with more than \$8.5 billion dollars in bonds. Voter in Los Angeles Unified School district alone approved a \$3.87 billion bond measure. School district voters once again demonstrated that Californians are willing to increase taxes for education. There were a total of 51 tax measures in 2004 of which 27 or 53 percent passed. This represented the highest pass rate in ten years of CEDA data though, in those ten years, school district voters turned down a majority of tax measures in only two years, 1995 and 2003.

Only one school district had a recall election. Voters in Farmersville Unified in Tulare County recalled four school board trustees. Voters in Paradise Unified in Butte County opted to abolish trustee areas and have at-large elections for their school board.

CANDIDATE ELECTIONS

A below average number of Californians ran for local office in 2003. Indeed, as reported in the 2003 CEDA Report, there were fewer local candidates in 2003 than in any odd-numbered election year since CEDA began in 1995. During odd-numbered years, an average 2,360 candidates ran for county, city and school district positions but only 2,106 did so in 2003. This trend was also apparent in 2004, though to a lesser degree. The average number of candidates in even-numbered years from 1996 through 2004 was 5,482. The 2004 total was 5,155 or 5.9 percent below the ten year average. The decline was most apparent among school board candidates: the 2,045 candidates in 2004 was 11.3 percent below the ten year average of 2,306 and was the lowest in CEDA records. The number of candidates for city elective offices was actually the highest since 1995 though the number of incorporated cities and thus the number of elective municipal positions has increased during this period. The number of counties and county positions has, however, remained static and in 2004 the number of candidates for county office, 878, was slightly higher than the average for presidential election years of 864. County-wide positions such as sheriff and district attorney are elected in gubernatorial election years (e.g. 1998, 2002) which results in a higher number of county candidates than in presidential election years (e.g., 1996, 2000, 2004) when only some county supervisor positions are up.

The number of candidates for Community Service Districts (CSD) and Community Service Areas (CSA) has increased over the years as the number of CSDs and CSAs have increased. In 2003 and 2004, a total of 60 such districts conducted elections in which 302 candidates ran. In comparison, in 1998 and 1999, only 26 CSDs and CSAs held elections involving 126 candidates. It should be noted that elections in many CSD and CSAs are cancelled pursuant to state law permitting a local jurisdiction to cancel an election if the number of candidates is equal to or fewer than the number of positions to be filled. The candidates are deemed to have "won" their election and take office. At least six CSDs that held elections in 2000 did not in 2004 because of this law.

As is typical in California and the Nation, incumbents seeking re-election enjoyed impressive re-election rates. This does not mean, however, that local elective offices did witness significant turnover. A high incumbent re-election rate simply means that incumbents running for re-election are successful but the percentage of all successful candidates who are incumbents is usually far less. In 2004, incumbent county supervisors had a re-election rate of 77.6 percent: 114 of 147 incumbents won re-election. However, of the 208 supervisors elected in 2004, only 114 or 54.8 percent were incumbents and 94 or 45.1 percent were non-incumbents. In 2004, 414 city council incumbents were elected for a re-election rate of 81 percent; but of the total of 811 council members elected, 51 percent were incumbents and 49 percent, or 397, were non-incumbents. Among school district elections in 2004, a total of 1,005 board trustee were elected of which 572 or 56.9 percent were incumbents and 433 or 43.1 percent were non-incumbents. Incumbent board trustees thus had a 76.1 percent re-election rate.

County Races. In 2004 there were 878 county candidates including 523 candidates for county supervisor, 235 candidates for CSD or CSA boards, 10 candidates for Districts Attorney, 107 for Superior Judge and 3 for Marshal. Incumbents represented 26.5 percent of all candidates, including 28.1 percent of county supervisor candidates, 28.1 percent also for CSD/CSA board director, 20 percent of DA candidates, 15.9 percent of Superior Court judge candidates and 33.3 percent of Marshal candidates. On the other hand, incumbents were the winners in 54.8 percent of supervisor races, 41.6 percent of CSD/CSA directors, 66.7 percent of DAs, 45.9 percent of judgeship races and the only Marshals race was won by the incumbent. Similarly, both incumbent District Attorneys seeking re-election were successful.

City Races. A total of 2,232 candidates for city office in 2004, including 1,810 for city council, 187 for mayor, 102 for city treasurer, 93 for city clerk, 6 for city attorney, and 34 for other city offices. As with county races, the majority of candidates were non-incumbents, the majority of winners (54.6 percent) were incumbents. City council members seeking re-election were very successful (81 percent re-election rate) but incumbents represented only 51 percent of winning council candidates. The re-election rate for mayors was 85.4 percent but only 54.7 percent of winning mayoral candidates were incumbents. Incumbents of other city positions were exceptionally successful with re-election rates of 100percent for city attorneys, 98.4 percent for city treasurers, and 96.6 percent for city clerks.

School Board Races. As a noted above, 2004 saw fewer candidates for school boards than in past years. A total of 2,045 Californians ran for school board seats of which 752 or 36.8 percent were incumbents and 1,293 or 63.2 percent were non-incumbents. Successful candidates were generally incumbents with 56.9 percent (572) of all winning candidates being incumbents. In other words, incumbent school trustees enjoyed a re-election rate of 76.1 percent.
